INVESTMENT POLICY

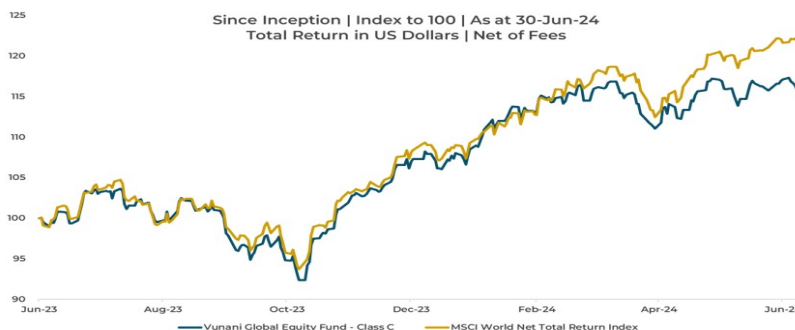
The Fund aims to achieve its objective by investing in global equity and equity-related securities.

RISK PROFILE

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Fund Commentary

for the quarter ending 30 June 2024

The MSCI World Index delivered a total return of 2.8% in US dollars over the quarter, a return which belies the underlying volatility during the quarter.

Following an exceptionally strong first quarter, it was not altogether surprising to see equity markets consolidating, with the MSCI World Index giving up 5.3% of the 8.4% gain registered in the first quarter, before rallying 7.8% from its mid-April lows.

Nvidia was once again the key driver of global market performance during the quarter. Having chalked up gains of over 90% between January and late-March, the share price tested bear-market levels, retracing 19.8% from late-March to mid-April, before rallying 77% to another all-time high on 18th June.

The revenue performance and outlook for Nvidia continues to surprise on the upside, with the company reporting topline growth of over 200% for the 12 months to April 2024 and raising guidance for the year ahead. Wall Street analysts now forecast 97% growth in revenue for the current financial year, which runs to 31 January 2025. Our concerns, expressed in not owning Nvidia in the Fund, stem from the sustainability of the growth and more specifically in the potential “normalisation” of operating margins over the medium term. Consensus forecasts suggest the company can sustain operating margins of over 60%, versus long run average margins of closer to 30%. We believe this is a classic case of a company “over-earning”, which ultimately corrects through a supply side response.

Applying a wider lens to global market performance, presents a different picture. The Stoxx Europe 600 Index delivered a relatively pedestrian 0.8% return in US dollars for the quarter, while the Stoxx Asia-Pacific and Nikkei 225 indices delivered returns of -2.8% and -7.7% respectively.

A measure of the lack of breadth in US equity returns is reflected in the performance of the Russell 2000 Index (-3.3%) of small cap stocks as well as the Equally Weighted S&P 500 Index (-2.6%), which both delivered negative returns during the quarter.

The Vunani Global Equity Fund – Class C delivered a net US dollar return of -0.8% during the quarter behind its benchmark, which returned 2.6%. The lack of exposure to Nvidia was a large explanatory factor in relative performance, so too weakness in Walt Disney and Airbus, which were both significant positive contributors in the first quarter.

The end of the quarter also marked the first anniversary of the track record, having launch in late-June 2023. For the 12 months, the fund delivered a return of 14.9%, again behind benchmark, the overwhelming majority of the relative performance resulting from Nvidia, offset to some extent by positive contributions from other technology exposures in the Fund, namely SAP, Apple, Alphabet and ASML.
